



Solid bronze. Solomon made one like this when he built the temple. (2 Chr 4:1).

Tiered stone. The restored temple would contain this type (Ezek 43:13–17).

Ancient Altars

Ancient people made offerings to appease the gods. The Israelites used different types of altars for whole burnt offerings to Yahweh.

Worked stone with horns. One like this was found at Beer-sheba.

Movable bronze-covered wood. The Israelites built this type in the wilderness (Exod 27:1–8).

Unworked stones with a hearthstone slab (Exod 20:25). One like this was discovered at Arad.

Any stone of the right size and shape that was nearby (Judg 13:19).

A rectangular mound of sod, clay, or mud-brick. Yahweh commanded Moses to build this kind (Exod 20:24).
